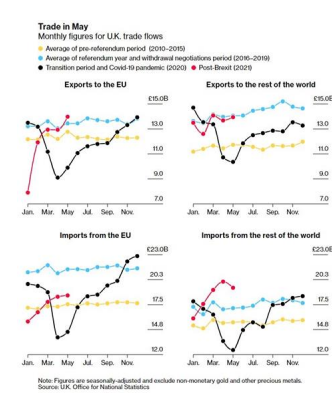

UK Trade Trend in May.

U.K. goods trade with the EU edged higher in May. Imports and exports both improved five months into the post-Brexit era.

Total exports of goods, excluding precious metals, increased 4.9% in May. That was driven by an 8% rise in exports to the EU, the latest data from the Office for National Statistics showed.

"The effect of new Brexit visa rules will only become fully apparent when people start traveling again, so in that sense, maybe the delta variant has pushed things back a little bit," said James Smith, an economist at ING.

BCC Trade update.

Last week, the UK government, Norway, Iceland and Liechtenstein signed an upgraded trade and co-operation agreement which includes:

- further tariff reductions on imports of prawns and white fish;
- a stronger reciprocal labour mobility scheme than in the EU-UK trade deal;
- further services market access;
- caps on mobile roaming charges; and
- mutual recognition of professional qualifications.

New UK scheme to drive trade with developing countries and boost jobs and growth.

The UK government has launched a consultation on new trade rules that will help countries lift themselves out of poverty - and help UK businesses and consumers at the same time.

The **Developing Countries Trading Scheme (DCTS)** is a major opportunity to develop free and fair trade with developing countries. This system would apply to 70 countries and would include improvements such as reduced tariffs and simplified rules of origin requirements for countries exporting to the UK.

Working safely during Coronavirus - guidance from Step 4.

The UK government has published the newly updated **working safety guidance** to support businesses in England through Step 4 of the roadmap. From Step 4, legal restrictions are lifted, all businesses can open and the government is no longer instructing people to work from home.

Businesses still have a legal duty to manage health and safety risks. You must carry out a health and safety risk assessment, including the risk of Coronavirus, and take reasonable steps to mitigate the risks you identify.

Freedom Day celebrated in England, with end of most COVID-19 restrictions.

Monday marked the end of laws mandating the wearing of masks and the enforcement of social distancing in England, with the last remaining closed businesses, such as nightclubs, reopening. Doctors and scientists have voiced concerns over the rise in COVID-19 infections as people across England ditched masks and social distancing on what has been dubbed **"Freedom Day"**.

But Prime Minister Boris Johnson urged caution as coronavirus case numbers continue to rise.
